- \*New Member Report: President Koonce swore in new member Corey Grubb.
- \*Medals and Awards Report: Sec/Treas Crow advised that a record book has been put together for members of the Color Guard. They should be keeping track of their activities and attendance for future awards. Training on the records will be provided at a later time. President Koonce then presented shoulder epaulets to Commander Mike Williams and Lt. Jim Williams to identify their rank with the Color Guard.
- \*Color Guard Report: Commander Williams reported the Color Guard has been involved in several events. They participated with the Oklahoma City Chapter's Color Guard at the Oklahoma City Comets Baseball game on April 19, marking the 250th anniversary of Paul Revere's ride. The Comets marketing team presented a video of Revere and the Lexington/Concord battles as the Color Guard marched on the field. A musket display was a crowd delight, but startled some of the players! The Guard has also attended the US Naturalization ceremonies, participated in the Armed Forces Day parade in McAlester, presented Flag Certificates to the Yukon Police Department and Canadian Valley Christian Academy, and participated in the Compatriot Grave Marking of Edward Williams. The El Reno National Day of Prayer was attended as well. We participated in the Patriot Grave Markings in Ste. Genevieve, Mo, over Memorial Day weekend. Keeping very busy!

  \*JROTC Committee: Compatriot Grubb reported he has been in touch with Compatriot Ken Young at the State Society about medals and awards for high school and college-level JROTC award winners. We will be ready in 2026.

\*State Society President Henry Baer then swore in the new officers to serve a two-year term. They are:

\*Sec/Treasurer Crow, who also serves as Chairman of the State Committee Growth and Expansion, presented to the chapter the need to sponsor the new chapter being formed in McAlester, which will be the Indian Nations Chapter of Oklahoma. Oklahoma City and Tulsa have declined to sponsor, and Norman never responded with an answer. Crow advised that the sponsorship was not going to require a lot more than providing Color Guard support when available, and the need for Dual members to meet the requirements as set forth by the NSSAR National Society. The target date for the chartering of the new chapter is August 1, 2025, and a tentative date has been set for August 9, 2025, for the Charter meeting. A discussion by those present came to the conclusion that the distance to McAlester was too great for regular chapter support, but Canadian Valley wholeheartedly would become the sponsor.

\*Sec/Treasurer Crow then discussed the need to create a speakers bureau within the chapter. It is imperative that we let the schools and churches know we are available to make presentations in the classroom.

\*Flag certificates were presented to the Yukon Police Department and Canadian Valley Christian School. We need to have more businesses to present these certificates.

\*Compatriot Noel Grubb and President Koonce have been working on a chapter logo and are almost finished. It will be sent around by email to the membership in the near future for approval. It will then be sent through the state society to get the National Society's approval for use
