

This site is regarded by most archeologists as one of the four most important pre- historic Indian sites east of the Rocky Mountains. Preservation from the Oklahoma History Center to guide us. During the March meeting of the OKC/SAR, retired U.S. Army Maj. Edward J. Pulido is awarded the Wounded Warrior Coin with certificate, War Service Medal with Iraq Bar and certificate and Purple Heart Pin, by President Martin Reynolds. On August 17, 2004, Major Pulido was driving a vehicle through "IED Alley" when his vehicle struck an improvised

explosive device (IED) that exploded underneath, resulting in his suffering a broken leg, arm, knee and pelvis. Fragments lodged in his abdomen and arm were removed; however, one piece of fragment could not be removed which caused an infection eventually requiring amputation of his left leg. Major Pulido was awarded the Purple Heart for wounds suffered. For his service in Iraq he was awarded the Bronze Star Medal iwth "V" for Valor, Meritorious Service Medal, Joint Service Commendation Medal and Joint Service Achievement Medal.
