

REVOLUTIONARY WAR LUMINARIES, FORT GIBSON



William D. Welge is a graduate of Central State University with a Master of Arts and History, Southwestern Studies, Summa Cum Laude. He also holds a degree in journalism from the University of Oklahoma. He has been certified by the Academy of Certified Archivists for many years and has served at the Oklahoma History Center, in a number of capacities.

<u>William D. Welge is author,</u> contributor and editor of a number of books and articles and reviews.

The focus on this topic will be primarily about Governor Montfort Stokes, former governor of North Carolina who was appointed commissioner to treat with the Cherokee Indians as they arrived in Indian Territory. Stokes served for a number of years at great hardship and personal loss of fortune while attending to his duties in the territory. His office was about six miles from Fort Gibson. Late in life in the early 1840's, Stokes mentions to his superiors in Washington D.C. about his war service during the fight to separate from the tyranny of the King of England. He is ignored by officials in Washington D.C. dying in 1842 and is buried at Fort Gibson.
