February Program DELBERT COULTER, WW II, POW

Please plan on attending the February dinner meeting and hearing the incredible real life story from Delbert Coulter, World War II Prisoner of War. As a Tech Sergeant, Delbert Coulter served as a B24 mechanical flight engineer and TOP Turret Gunner. He received the Purple Hear, Cross of Valor among other citations. He is a member of the Central Oklahoma chapter of American Ex-POW's. Del's story is presented in the Eisenhower Library in Abilene, KS, and the Library of Congress in Washington DC. Delbert Coulter's plane and crew were shot down after a bombing mission over the town of Gotha, Germany. Not only was he interred in two German prison camps, but was forced, along with thousands of other soldiers to walk 550 miles on what is now called "the Black March". When captured in Germany in 1944 he weighed in at 189 pounds. 14 months later when rescued he weighed 90 pounds. He was freed 5 months before the war ended by Japanese formal surrender. Please join fellow Compatriots in welcoming Delbert Coulter to our February dinner meeting. Joining Delbert will be his wife, Myra. Welcome Delbert & Myra.
