In the early morning hours of November 11, 1918, representatives of France, Britain, and Germany met in a railroad car near Compie'gne, France, to sign an armistice ending World War I, or the Great War as it was know at that time. For many years November 11 was knows as Armistice Day to honor those who fought in World War I. In 1954 Congress changed the name to **Veterans Day to recognize all American Veterans.**

Every November 11th, at 11:00 a.m., the nation pays tribute to its war dead with the laying of a presidential wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Arlington National Cemetery outside Washington, D.C. But Veterans Day honors more than the dead. Memorial Day, observed in May is for remembering soldiers who lost their lives in the service of their country. Veterans Day is set aside to honor and thank all who have served in the U.S. armed forces.....particularly our 23 million living veterans.
