

## **THE FEDERALIST PAPERS**



Andrew Spiropoulos is a Professor of Law at the Oklahoma City University School of Law and is Director of the School's Center for the Study of State Constitutional Law and Government. He is a graduate of Carleton College and received an MA in political science and his law degree from the University of Chicago.

Before joining the faculty in 1991,

Danny J. Boggs of the United States Court

of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit and

practiced law with the Chicago firm of

Gardner, Carton & Douglas.

From 2005 to 2006, he served as Senior Counselor to the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives. He has been a

Heritage Foundation Salvatori Fellow, was the Reporter of the Uniform Interstate Enforcement of Domestic-Violence Protection Orders Act, and is currently the Milton Friedman Distinguished Fellow at the Oklahoma Council of Public Affairs. Professor Spiropoulos writes and teaches in the fields of constitutional law, legislation, state and local government, and political theory.

The Federalist Papers: October 27, 1787, saw the publication of the first in a series of essays written by Alexander Hamilton, James Madison, and John Jay urging ratification of the Constitution. Written under the name "Publius," the eighty-five essays appeared mainly in New York newspapers and were later compiled in book form as The Federalist. They remain a brilliant explanation of the principles of American government. In "Federalist No. 1," Hamilton reminded Americans that for the first time, a nations's people would have the chance to freely decide what kind of government they want.

Please join your fellow Compatriots in welcoming Professor Spiropoulos and enjoy his most interesting presentation of "The Federalist Papers".

## **VETERANS DAY, NOVEMBER 11, 2014**

In the early morning hours of November 11, 1918, representatives of France, Britain, and Germany met in a railroad car near Compie'gne, France, to sign an armistice ending World War I, or the Great War as it was know at that time. For many years November 11 was knows as Armistice Day to honor those who fought in World War I. In 1954 Congress changed the name to Veterans Day to recognize all American Veterans.

Every November 11th, at 11:00 a.m., the nation pays tribute to its war dead with the laying of a presidential wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Arlington National Cemetery outside Washington, D.C. But Veterans Day honors more than the dead. Memorial Day, observed in May is for remembering soldiers who lost their lives in the service of their country. Veterans Day is set aside to honor and thank all who have served in the U.S. armed forces.....particularly our 23 million living veterans.
