Al Lankford reports our chapter has purchased a 3 DVD set of the 2010 Spring lecture series presented by Dr. J. Rufus Fears (Ph.D., Harvard). "Professor Fears is engaging, entertaining and on occasion humorous. He is David Ross Boyd Professor of Classics at the University of Oklahoma, an acclaimed teacher and scholar with 25 awards for teaching excellence. He demonstrates a deep understanding and passion for his subject. The set is divided into 6 lectures each runs about 40 minutes, the lecture titles are: 1. "The Declaration of Independence and Its Meaning for Today"; 2. "The Miracle of the Constitution"; 3. "What the Founders Intended by the Constitution"; 4. "The Bill of Rights: Reclaiming of the Founders 'Legacy of Freedom'; 5. Audience Questions; 6. Special Memorial Day Lecture: 'The Last Full Measure of Devotion'. At 40 minutes each these might be a bit long for presentation at our meetings, maybe not?" Al now has these DVD's and will take them to our meetings and would encourage others to borrow and view them as well. Al said "My personal favorite is the Memorial Day Lecture and I found it very inspiring".
