### **"Bringing Back the Black Robed Regiment"**

In this presentation, Representative Dan Fisher, Yukon, gives the history of American pastors during the Revolutionary War and shows how they were the primary force in the fight for liberty. He shows that the British so hated these pastors that they gave them the title of the "Black Robed Regiment". In this message, Dan illustrates how that, had it not been for the preachers' strong stand in the 18th century, America would probably never have come to be. He proves that if today's preachers do not return

to the Faith of the Founders and begin to take the same stand as the preachers of the Revolution, America may not survive!

Dan believes that America is facing a crisis today much the same as the one faced by the country in 1776. He says it is time for the preachers of America to respond to God's call and fully engage in the culture war that is destroying our liberties and will eventually, if not checked, steal away our religious liberty and our opportunity to freely preach the Gospel.

Dan Fisher grew up in Van Buren, Arkansas and is a graduate of Westark Community College and Arkansas Tech

University. He and the former Pam Loftin have been married for 31 years and have two children, Jacob, 25 years and wife Brittany, and Rebekah, 20 years and husband Tony Wise. Dan and Pam have a few horses on their 20 acres just West of Yukon, OK where they live in a log house they built themselves. Rep. Dan Fisher is Senior Pastor at Trinity Baptist Church in Yukon, OK, and one of the first original Pulpit Freedom Pastors.
