## Oklahoma delegates attend national convention in July



## Six Foreign-Born Patriots 1. Baron Friedrich Von Steuben

Baron Friedrich Von Steuben (1730-1794) was a German officer who served with the Continental Army by training the forces stationed at Valley Forge during the winter of 1777-1778.

Taking the Continental Army, which had a reputation for being disorganized, undisciplined, and poorly drilled, Baron Von Steuben introduced new sanitation measures, and began training the

troops in 18th century military tactics that included bayonet combat and more effective techniques for firing and reloading muskets.

The Baron was a former Prussian military officer who had once served on the staff of Frederick the Great. Though prone to exaggeration—he wore flashy uniforms and styled himself a lieutenant general even though he had never risen above the rank of captain—he possessed a keen military mind.

The Baron's successes saw him appointed inspector general of the Continental Army in May 1778, and over the next two years, his drill methods helped transform the patriot forces into an accomplished fighting force. He also penned the first military manual for the American army, "Regulations for the Order and Discipline of the Troops of the United States." This "Blue Book", as it was known, remained the bible of the American armed forces until the War of 1812.
